(CGEIT™)

Market need for CGEIT

- **Individual:** defines the roles and responsibilities of professionals performing IT governance work and recognizes their professional knowledge and competencies; skill-sets; abilities and experiences
- **Enterprise:** supports through the demonstration of a visible commitment to excellence in IT governance practices
- **Profession:** supports the growing business demands related to IT governance
- **Business:** increases the awareness of IT governance good practices and issues

CGEIT – Who is it for?

The certification is intended to recognize a wide range of professionals for their knowledge and application of IT governance principles and practices. It is designed for professionals who have management, advisory, or assurance responsibilities as defined by the CGEIT Job Practice consisting of IT governance related task and knowledge statements.

CGEIT Experience Requirements

- Pass the CGEIT exam (first exam - December 2008)
- Adhere to the ISACA Code of Professional Ethics
- Agree to comply with the CGEIT Continuing Education Policy
- Provide evidence of appropriate IT governance work experience as defined by the CGEIT Job Practice

CGEIT Job Experience Requirements

- Five (5) or more years of experience managing, providing advisory and/or assurance services, and/or otherwise supporting the governance of an organization's information technology. This experience can be achieved entirely through IT governance experience, or through a combination of IT governance experience combined with management experience.
- **IT Governance Experience:** A minimum of two years of IT governance experience is required performing tasks directly related to any two or more of the following six domains (see next slide)
- **Management Experience:** Up to three years of experience associated with the governance of the IT-related contribution to an enterprise to achieve its strategic objectives will be accepted. Substitutions apply.

CGEIT Job Practice

Job Practice—A job practice serves as the basis for the exam and the experience requirements to earn the CGEIT certification. This job practice consists of task and knowledge statements, organized by domains and are intended to depict the tasks performed by individuals who have a significant management, advisory, or assurance role relating to the governance of IT and the knowledge required to perform these tasks. The domains are as follows:

- IT Governance Framework
- Strategic Alignment
- Value Delivery
- Risk Management
- Resource Management
- Performance Measurement

CGEIT exam

- First exam planned for December 2008
- Content will be primarily based on ITGI research which will serve as study products

CGEIT grandfathering

Highly experienced professionals who have had a significant management, advisory and/or assurance role relating to the governance of IT will be allowed to apply for CGEIT certification without being required to pass the CGEIT examination.

To earn the CGEIT certification during this grandfathering period, an applicant must:

- Have and submit evidence of eight (8) years of experience, with a minimum of three (3) of these years performing tasks directly related to any two or more of the aforementioned CGEIT domains.
- Describe (200-500 words) their experience managing, providing advisory and/or assurance services, and/or otherwise supporting the governance of an enterprise's information technology.
